

# Improving orphan articles


1. Checking what is already linked (for orphans, usually nothing)
  - An "orphan article" is an article that has nothing (or very little) that links to it: this is bad for visibility!
2. Good starts: notable alumni, colleagues, family members, awards received



# Assigning yourself articles


**Why:** so your contributions are tracked

**How:**






# Editing 101

1. Enabling visual editor (for those scared of source codes [me])
  - Navigate to the preferences section in personal settings
  - From there, navigate to "Editing" and check "Enable the visual editor"
2. Actually editing your article (!!!!!!!)
  - Press "Edit" in the top toolbar (this is the easy part)


# Editing 102

## 2. Actually editing your article (!!!!!!)

- Navigate to where you will be linking your person
- After adding them to the text, use the "Link" button to automatically link back to their Wiki
  - Select the appropriate link

## 3. Citing your sources

- There is also a handy "Cite" button!
- Place your cursor where you will be inserting your source prior to pressing "Cite"





# Editing 103

## 3. Citing your sources

- Using the same source from the original article
- Press "edit source" in the subsection you are working from
  - Copy everything between the two "<ref>"s
  - Paste into the "Automatic" tab after pressing "Cite"; Press "Create"
  - If shown multiple options, click "Insert" on the correct one
  - (IF there are issues with your source, like mine, let me know and I can help fix it!)

## 4. Publish your changes!!!!

- Describe your changes
  - Eg "linked so-and-so's wiki"
